Logistics

Our 7 hour course is facilitated both in a classroom and in-vehicle. In order to facilitate the classroom element of this course we will require:

A suitable room to comfortably seat all attending.

For in-vehicle training we will require:

- Drivers to be able to read a number plate from 20 metres in good day light with or without corrective vision.
- Drivers to produce their domestic driving licence or International Drivers Permit.
- Drivers have a reasonable command of English.
- Vehicle meets all Road Traffic Act requirements.
